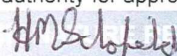

The increase in precept for 2018/19 includes money to build up reserve funds for future projects including 2 large expenditure projects: the replacement of a community sports pavilion (£4,500) and a review of the local Neighbourhood Plan (£5,000).

The reduction in other income received is due to a reduction in the VAT reclaimed during the year. In 2017/18 the Parish Council purchased a new piece of playground equipment giving a VAT reclaim of £8,128). No major capital expenditure was carried out in 2018/19 and the VAT reclaim was £5,148).
