

Foreword

We have seen many advances in communications since the last edition of the Parish Guide in 2000. Much of the history of West Hoathly Parish is recorded in the West Hoathly Local History Archives, although there is always more to investigate! Internet communication including Hoathly Hub and more recently by Facebook groups enable rapid dissemination of information. However there is still much local contact information, especially valuable to welcome newcomers and visitors, which is less easy to find. This Parish Guide seeks to provide that information. For the first time a street plan of West Hoathly and Sharpthorne villages is included. The Street Index covers the whole parish. This pamphlet is much reduced in content from previous editions, because the historical context has now been captured in the publications mentioned on page 4.

Crime and Incident Reporting

Phone 101. Local police offices opening hours: East Grinstead, Chequer Mead 10-2pm Mon -Fri; Haywards Heath Bolnore Rd 10-2p.m. and 3-6p.m. Crawley Northgate Ave Mon - Sat 9am -8pm.

Doctors and Hospitals

There is no surgery in the parish. Subject to availability, new residents can usually apply to register with any health centre within five miles of their dwelling with Crawley Down surgery, East Grinstead Ship Street surgery or with Ashdown Forest surgery in Forest Row. A Minor Injuries Unit (not 24 hours) is available at Queen Victoria Hospital, Holtye Rd East Grinstead. The nearest 24 hour A&E is at Princess Royal Hospital, Haywards Heath. Specialist in patient services may be provided at the East Surrey Hospital at Redhill; the Royal Sussex Hospital at Brighton; or the Kent and East Sussex Hospital at Pembury near Tunbridge Wells.

Defibrillators

These are located on outside walls at the main entrance to West Hoathly School, Sharpthorne Organic Cafe, West Hoathly Bowls Club and Highbrook Village Hall. The first three are kept in weatherproof cases fixed to an outside wall whereas the Highbrook unit is in the porch. Phone 999 and ask for an ambulance. The weatherproof case door will open to release the defibrillator without a release code. Don't open the defibrillator until it is next to the casualty when it will talk you through the first aid process.

Communications

"Hoathly Hub" and "The West Hoathly and Sharpthorne Community Facebook" provide on-line forums for news, events and information. A directory of Parish Council documents including minutes and forthcoming agendas is also accessible via Hoathly Hub. West Hoathly Chronicle is published, printed and distributed six times annually by volunteers to over 600 households.

Public Utilities

The local electricity network of underground cables, overhead wires and transformer substations is operated by United Utilities. Water is supplied by South East Water to whom leaks should be reported. Waste water is collected by Southern Water.

Buses

Metrobus service No. 84 no longer serves West Hoathly, Queens Square. Bus Stops are at Station Road, Sharpthorne; The Fox and Broadfield (Chapel Row), for West Hoathly. The expected real time of arrival of the bus can be verified by using a mobile phone to send sms code wsxapadg for the Crawley direction of travel and wsxtwtwg for East Grinstead direction to 84268. If you have an iphone you can download an App such as Next Bus or Bus Checker to receive the same information.

Local Government

West Hoathly Parish Council is non-political. It is managed by Parish Clerk Helen Schofield from the Parish Office in the Village Hall. The Parish Council comprises 11 councillors who are elected to serve for four years. If vacancies occur members usually co-opt a new councillor to fill a vacancy. Parish Councils are consulted on many issues but have limited statutory duties. Local Councils have powers under the 1974 Local Government Act to raise a local tax to serve the parish as the Members determine. The Parish Council meet every month except August. An Annual Parish meeting is held in March or April each year when a report on the activities is presented to the community.

Mid Sussex District Council is the second tier local authority. Two political councillors are elected to serve for four years to represent High Weald Ward, comprising West Hoathly, Horsted Keynes and Lindfield Rural (including Scaynes Hill) Parishes. Its main responsibilities are planning and

building control as well as collecting household waste, elections and collecting local government taxes.

West Sussex County Council is the principal local authority responsible for education, social matters, roads, rights of way, minerals and waste disposal. One County Councillor is elected every four years to serve and represent both Lindfield and the High Weald Parishes.

The Historic Parish

West Hoathly Past and Present - Parish Guide and Footpath Map was first produced in 1958. It included a parish footpath map and historical summary by Ursula Ridley. A map is now unnecessary as a 5": mile map of the parishes of Ardingly, Horsted Keynes and West Hoathly is now available and public rights of way are mapped on-line by the West Sussex County Council iMap. Much of this historical context has been elaborated upon in publications by Kay Coutin and members of West Hoathly History Group. Out and about in West Hoathly, West Sussex from Early Days to Modern Times, 2005; and The History of the Iron Industry in West Hoathly, 2008; (Both are out of print but are sometimes available from online bookdealers such as Abe Books) In & Out in West Hoathly, West Sussex; The story of the Cat Inn & Queens Square & the People who lived there, 2012, is available from the Local History Group secretary.

As the owner of Stonelands, between 1895 and his death in 1948 John Godwin King CBE contributed enormously to this community, and to East Sussex County Council as a County Councillor and J.P. He saved the Priest House from dereliction and endowed it as a museum. He restored The Manor House as a residence for his daughter, Ursula Ridley.

The Priest House, now the only one of its kind open to the public, is an early 15th-century half-timbered hall house once owned by Lewes Priory. The interior houses a fascinating museum of Sussex Folklore, with a traditional cottage garden surrounding the house. *The Story of a Forest Village - West Hoathly* is an enthralling work of historical fiction by Ursula Ridley. A few copies of the Second Edition are still available from The Priest House Museum.

The Sussex Archaeological Society open The Priest House from March to October on Tuesdays - Saturdays from 10.30am to 5.30pm and on Sundays and Monday Bank Holidays from noon to 5:30pm. www.sussexpast.co.uk


West Hoathly History Group meets each month from September to April in Sharpthorne Church Hall. A remarkable collection of archives has been assembled and an annual exhibitions in held in West Hoathly Village Hall when hundreds of photographs line the walls. Some of these are captured with historical context in *Old West Hoathly* ISBN 978-0-9571205-0-1. This book is currently available from the author and local history archivist John Ralph.

The 5": mile OS map published by the Parish Map Company is available from the Costcutter shop, Top Road, Sharpthorne. Topical reports from Clubs and Organisations, local events and times of worship can be found in the West Hoathly Chronicle, produced six times annually. The Chronicle is available from the Organic Cafe in Sharpthorne and in St Margarets Church.


St Margarets church is opened daily. The upper churchyard has step-free access to a viewing point with spectacular views towards the Lewes Gap in the South Downs. Terraces connect the upper and lower churchyard. *The Friends of West Hoathly Churchyard Trust* is a registered charity that supports the work of maintenance, repair and improving this unusual churchyard. *Friends of The Priest House* raise funds to support this historic house.
