There were 3 members of the public present. A member of the public introduced themself as the owner of Philpots Farm and outlined their objections to application DM/23/1973 that is on the agenda. The member of the public explained how three sides of the permitter wall of the proposal are jointly owned and asbestos is present in the barn roof. Several highways concerns were also raised, including the increase in traffic and the concern that there is not much turning room at the site.

AONB Rebranding

On 22nd November 2023 all Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) were renamed as National Landscapes. This included a logo change to the one below.



High Weald National Landscape

The intention is to unite all 46 National Landscapes across England and Wales, raise the profile of the National Landscapes network and create greater understanding and awareness of the work of National Landscape Partnerships.

The High Weald has recently obtained funding to explore how it can become more inclusive and accessible. One very successful project has been the replacement of gates for stiles. The project will provide the gate for farmers and landowners to fit (although funding can be obtained if necessary for this as well). Polling Districts and Polling Places Review

Armed Forces Veterans Drop-In sessions and Breakfast Clubs

Plans are underway to set up a Veterans Drop-In and Breakfast Club in East Grinstead. Once this is established, I will be looking to set up a similar arrangement in Haywards Heath and Burgess Hill supported by Officers of MSALC and Lin Stockwell.

The Chairman explained how as requested by the Council, the Jubilee/Coronation planning group held a meeting to gain the wider view of the committee. The majority of the committee were in favour of using the funds for the 'Big Picnic' event that is being arranged by St Margaret's Church.

Considering this additional information the Parish Council voted on the grant request, 7 were in favour, 1 was against.

It was therefore agreed to grant £650 from the Jubilee/Coronation fund to St Margarets Church for the 'Big Picnic' event.

207) To consider a motion proposed by Cllr Paul Brown that West Hoathly Parish Council agrees to urge Metrobus, Division Member and West Sussex County Council to engage with this Council and work towards implementing changes to provide a viable and sustainable bus service 84 (supporting paper supplied)

The supporting paper was circulated to councillors with the agenda. Cllr Brown provided more detail on the proposal and explained why it had been put forward as a formal motion.

Following discussion Cllr Douglas Denham St Pinnock proposed an amendment to the motion to include.

or

To permanently reinstate a 'hail and ride' bus service between Dunnings Mill and Turners Hill (Sopers), in both directions.

With this amendment the motion was unanimously agreed. (see appendix 1)

County Cllr Garry Wall agreed to support the motion.

Appendix 1

Public Transport Metrobus Service 84

West Hoathly Parish Council notes that the bus service serving residents in West Hoathly Parish which includes Sharpthorne and West Hoathly, (and also Turners Hill), does not provide, in the opinion of this Council, a sustainable or viable bus service. This bus service currently does not enable: -

- a) a bus in the afternoon timed so that commuters can return home. The last bus departs from Crawley at 16:10 and the last bus departs from East Grinstead at 17:10, meaning the service is not suitable for commuting and employment.
- b) connection with Crawley Down for medical centre, shops and connecting bus services 281 and 291 towards East Grinstead which would afford half-hourly connectivity from Crawley Down to East Grinstead.
- c) setting down and picking up at points of interest along the attractive rural route serving both West Hoathly Parish residents and visitors from Crawley and East Grinstead. There are no bus stops along the route in the zone formerly designated as 'Hail and Ride', meaning that the service between Turners Hill and Saint Hill Green has not been publicised. Metrobus drivers cannot be relied upon to stop to pick-up or drop off at the following locations: -

Legsheath Lane for Weirwood Reservoir; Grinstead Lane / Chilling Street for Tyes Cross; Eight Acre & Duckyls Cottages for Stonelands; Selsfield Common.

Therefore Council agrees to urge Metrobus, Division Member and West Sussex County Council to engage with this Council and work towards implementing the following changes to provide a viable and sustainable bus service 84.

- i) To provide an additional later service 84 bus from Crawley and from East Grinstead so that residents have a sustainable bus service.
- ii) To revert Service 84 to its previous route such that all service buses travel to and from Crawley and Three Bridges via A264 Copthorne Common Rd, B2028, Crawley Down War Memorial, Station Road and Grange Road, Turners Hill 'The Crown', Turners Hill Park, West Hoathly-Chapel Row, Sharpthorne, Saint Hill Green, Dunnings Road, Hurst Farm Road, Brooklands Way, Railway Approach terminating at East Grinstead King Street and commencing service in the Crawley direction at East Grinstead War Memorial.
- iii) To provide, advertise and promote four additional bus stops at Legsheath Lane for Weirwood Reservoir; Grinstead Lane / Chilling Street for Tyes Cross; 8 Acre & Duckyls Cottages for Stonelands; and at Selsfield Common.

To permanently reinstate a 'hail and ride' bus service between Dunnings Mill and Turners Hill (Sopers), in both directions.

Informatives

Tulley's Farm had established a thriving farm shop in Turners Hill Road which has now closed. Service 84 route towards Three Bridges via Crawley Down and Copthorne Common Rd was redirected via Turners Hill Rd towards Worth Corner and Three Bridges. The important connection for both West Hoathly and Turners Hill residents to shops and medical centre at Crawley Down was lost.

In East Grinstead Town it is proposed that the Herontye Drive anticlockwise route is discontinues except for the morning and evening school services. All other services would terminate at King Street. This stopping place is adjacent to public conveniences and town centre cafes where the driver can take a rest break. The bus would then proceed via Cantalupe Rd to East Grinstead War Memorial as the starting point for all services. This was the former route.

The routing of morning and afternoon service 84 in East Grinstead, serving students attending Sackville and Imberhorne schools in East Grinstead would remain unchanged. Sackville school pupils are served by the Lewes Rd bus stop on the A22 near to the Toucan crossing. Imberhorne upper school pupils morning service should follow the same route as service 281 via Whitehall and Brooklands Way, and Gardenwood Road. For the evening pick-up service at Sackville school the bus would follow the War Memorial, Ship Street, Herontye Drive route to pick-up on Lewes Rd and then follow exactly the same route as the morning drop off service to Imberhorne continuing along Imberhorne Lane to Saint Hill Green (missing out Hurst Farm Rd and Dunnings Road) and then onwards towards Sharpthorne.
